

Sixth Form Dress Code

Please dress in a manner appropriate to a working environment in which you will be meeting people with a variety of attitudes from different age groups and representing our Sixth Form in the community.

Acceptable clothing:

Young Men

- **A suit or jacket and trousers.** Acceptable colours for suits are **black, brown, grey or navy blue.** Patterns are permissible as long as they are subtle and reflect the principle of smart professional dress (i.e. – pin stripes).
- Shirts can be plain, modestly patterned (i.e. stripes and checks) short or long sleeved, providing they are tailored and designed for professional dress.
- Waistcoats and jumpers may accompany suits.
- **Ties should be worn.**
- Smart formal shoes in black, grey or brown.

Young Women

- **Smart trousers/skirt/dress with an optional dark jacket.**
- Skirts should not be excessively short or tight.
- Shirts, tops or blouses must not be low cut.
- Cardigan/jumper/waistcoat may accompany suits/trousers/skirt/dress.
- **Smart dark coloured formal shoes or boots.**
- Denim should not be worn in any form.

Accessories - Jewellery must be subtle and consistent with smart professional dress.

Piercings and tattoos. Any piercing or tattoos students have must be discrete; tattoos must not be visible in school.

Students who failure to adhere to the Sixth Form dress code will be asked to go home and change. Failure to meet our dress requirements could result in a review of the student's place in the Sixth Form.

Unacceptable Clothing

- Torn or scruffy clothes.
- Hats.
- Revealing, low-cut tops.
- Short skirts or shorts.
- Flip flops. Uggs or similar boots, trainers.
- Vests.
- Shorts or Leggings.
- Tracksuit bottoms.
- Jeans.
